

The majestic Sendai River flows from east to west through lush flora in Kagoshima Prefecture's northern region, cascading forcefully before flowing gracefully into the ocean.

The Sendai River, which is Kyushu's second-longest river at 137 km, flows through the prefecture's northern municipalities, undulating like a giant dragon. The scenery is a constant source of inspiration, with mountain streams flowing through lush flora, tremendous waterfalls pouring down, and the entire river surface blanketed in mist. Rice paddies line both sides of the river, the little mountains are adorned with seasonal flowers, and birds chirp sweetly.

Isa's vegetation is serene. A crystal clear stream flows gently, cascading into a mighty waterfall.

Isa is located on the boundary of Kumamoto and Miyazaki prefectures, and the Sendai River that flows through the city is dramatic and appealing to the sense of fun. The upper reaches of the tributary provide lush green areas to relax, such as Lake Jisso. Fishing and bird watching can also be enjoyed on the stream. On the other hand, the main river has the Sogi Falls, admired as the Niagara of the East. The cool summer air, the colorful autumn foliage, and the cherry blossoms in the spring are all worthwhile experiences. Visitors can also take a walk through history, including the remains of the Sogi Power Plant, which are only visible during the drought season.

The town of Satsuma, known as the "back parlor of Kagoshima," is home to beautiful bamboo groves. The bamboo groves, which remind one of Princess Kaguya, have a rejuvenating effect on the mind and body. The Sendai River sparkles and turns into rapids as it flows through Satsuma. It fiercely washes over rocky surfaces before becoming deeper water. The Todoroki no Se in Miyanojo is famous, and poets such as Akiko Yosano have visited and composed poems about it. The shore of the Sendai River extends below the embankment, where vegetation thrives, and birds rest their wings. Between October and March, you can observe Sendaigawa Arashi, one of Japan's three great river phenomena, in the early morning hours. Bucolic landscapes flank the middle stretches of the river, where ears of rice sway in the breeze and trees are laden with fruits. Plum blossoms bloom, signaling the coming of spring at Fujikawa Tenjin Shrine near the river. The landscape changes with the seasons, from lush foliage in summer t sepia-toned autumn and white snow in winter.

Four Seasons of Sendai River

(at their northern limit), and Lake Kodaira, located in Yorita, has a natural habitat of prickly water lilies, the prefecture's protected species.

Cladopus japonicus is a plant species that grows naturally on the bedrock of a fast-flowing stream located in Yamazaki, Satsuma. Thorea, another protected plant species of Japan, can be found growing on the riverbed near the Arakawa Tenjin Bridge over the Sendai River in Isa. In addition, the southernmost colonies of woodland peonies can be found near the prefectural border in Okuchi. Mallards, Eurasian wigeons, great egrets, little egrets, dunlins, red-necked stints, and gray-tailed tattlers may all be seen in the estuary, while little grebes, spot-billed ducks, crested kingfishers, and brown dippers can be seen in the river's middle reaches

terms of insects, the area is home to important species such as the beech-feeding Fujisan reen Hairstreak (at their southern limit), the evergreen oak-feeding Wonderful Green Hairstreak, ne yellow-legged tortoiseshell, and the callophrys ferrea butterflies, as well as the parechthistatu bber nakanei Miyake and tengius kurosawai Makihara beetles.
